Community Outreach is Calvary's response to the admonition in Matthew to take care of our neighbor.

Through the generosity and caring spirit of Calvary members and others in the community, Community Outreach has provided many families with furniture, household items and bedding. Requests for needed items are published within Calvary and members step forward to contribute.

The primary focus of Community Outreach, which is led and staffed by Calvary volunteers, is to contribute to the stabilization of individuals and families in the Perham and surrounding communities. Referrals come from the Perham Food Shelf, Someplace Safe, other churches, public schools and Otter Tail-Wadena Community Action Council.

Because of donations from Calvary's members, Community Outreach is also able to provide limited emergency assistance for gas and food to people who are in a time of crisis.

## ❖ Stephen Ministry ❖

Stephen Ministers are trained lay people who provide ongoing one-to-one Christian care to people experiencing a wide range of life struggles or crisis. Stephen ministers listen, accept, care, support, encourage and walk with a person who is going through a difficult time. They pray with and for their care receiver for as long as they are needed.

Christ's love for mankind is shown through Stephen Ministers caring for one person at a time.

## ❖ Meal Ministry ❖

This Calvary ministry provides meals for people in need to meet the stress of major events in their lives such as birth, death, illness or any stressful event that disrupts the pattern of living. The number of meals per week and the length of time provided can be determined on an individual basis. These meals are prepared and delivered by volunteers from Calvary.

If in the course of your own ministry through Calvary you find someone who would benefit from this kind of service, please tell them about Meal Ministry and that these meals are provided to them as a gift. Decide with them how many meals would be helpful and ask what would be the most helpful time to deliver the meals. Let them know that the meal Ministry Coordinator will call them to arrange all other details.

## ❖ TWIGS ❖

TWIGS (Together Winning In God's Service) strives to meet ongoing needs of individuals and families in our community that cannot be met through traditional resources. Examples of recent needs include assistance with utility bills, wheelchair ramp, preschool tuition and medical prescriptions. Needs are available for individuals to sponsor partially or in full. All funds flow through Calvary's office so all donations are tax deductible. Confidentiality is a priority; the person receiving help will not know the person giving or vice versa. All that is known to both parties is that Calvary's TWIGS program was involved. Members of Calvary join together with Leaf River Area Habitat for Humanity throughout East Otter Tail, Wadena and Todd Counties. Since 1994 more than 25 houses have been built or renovated. Calvary and Leaf River Habitat are all part of the national Habitat for Humanity effort which former President Carter has been active in.

You can become involved with Habitat for Humanity by helping on the construction site, serving on the board of directors, helping with office work, donating building materials or by making a monetary gift.
